English



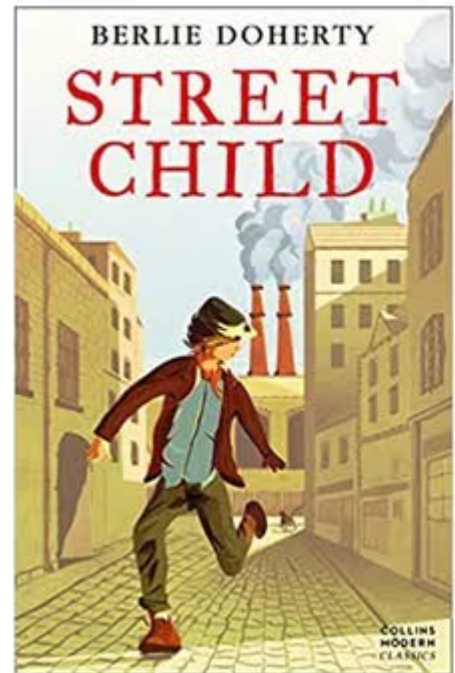
During this term we will be reading *Street Child* which is about a young boy who ends up in the workhouse but manages to escape and find refuge with Dr Barnardo. Prior to reading the book, we will research about the workhouse and then write a non-chronological report with the findings. Following this, we will produce a range of writes from recounts, descriptions and a persuasive letter.

We will also focus on a range of grammar such as word classes (modal verbs, nouns, verbs, adverbs, adjective, proper nouns, common nouns), speech, sentence structure, fronted adverbials and tense.

As part of our guided reading lessons, we will look at a range of text types including fiction, non-fiction and poetry.

History



Has education always been this way? KS2 Unit: Thematic study extending beyond 1066:
Education

Over the course of this term we will be looking at how education has changed/developed over time. We will look particularly at the Victorian Era and compare it to education today. We will also link it to our learning in English.

Geography



Our theme for this half term is 'Amazon Adventures'. We will learn:

- Where Brazil is in the world and the differing landscapes in Brazil. We will look at the climate and compare it to ours.
- Who lives in Brazil and the different types of settlement. We will use Google Earth to help us explore different regions.
- We will focus on the rainforests in Brazil, looking at the different layers and the vegetation and inhabitants.
- We will look at produce from the rainforest and how it is exported around the world.
- We will look at the cycle of the Brazil nut linked to interdependence of species in the rainforest and trade.

P.E.

P.E. will be on the following day: Monday

Please make sure that your child has their P.E. kit in school. Their PE kit consists of: a plain red or white polo shirt or t-shirt or a school's PE top, black shorts or tracksuit bottoms and trainers. A jumper maybe worn but must plain red or black.

We will be learning about fitness during our Boot Camp lessons in Autumn 1 and in Autumn 2 we will be learning about invasion games.



Music



Music will be on the following day: Monday

The children throughout the year will learn how to play a brass instrument. They will either learn to play the baritone, trombone or cornet.

During the autumn term they will learn how to put their instrument together, how to produce a sound and how to play simple songs using up to 3 notes.

They will also revisit musical vocabulary and begin to learn musical notation.

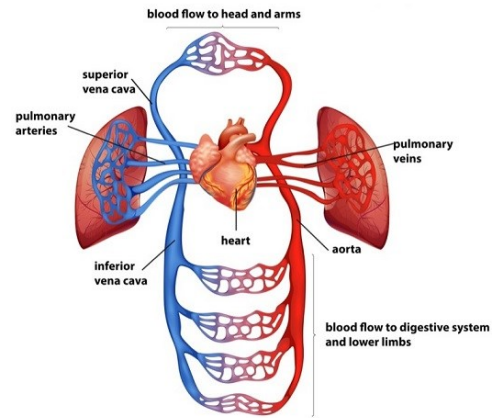
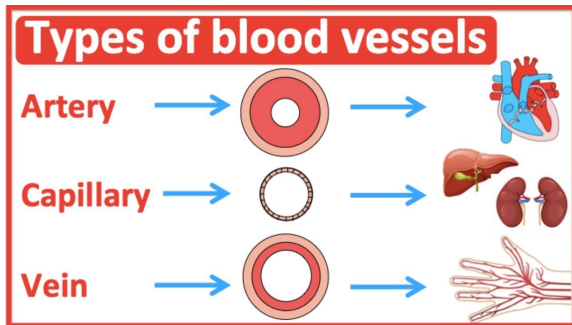
Keep Change Flip



Science



As part of our animals including humans topic in science, we will be focusing on the circulatory system. We will conduct numerous experiments to investigate this.
